- Youth Connexions is part of the SfYP.
- The overarching objective of SfYP "is to prepare young people to make a successful transition to adult and working life" and improve the outcomes for young people.

Aims of Youth Connexions



- To develop young people's personal and social skills through a range of youth work opportunities.
- To support vulnerable young people aged 13 -19 years (25 years for some groups such as care leavers and young people with learning disabilities) receive **targeted support** to enable them to reach their potential.
- To support young people to stay and progress in learning until age 18, minimising the numbers that are not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET).
- To enable young people to access the appropriate advice, guidance and support to enable them to make the right learning and job choices.
- To reduce referrals to specialist services.
- To support young people to become more resilient.

Youth Connexions



Youth Connexions consists of two main areas of work:

Youth Work

Information, Advice and Guidance

Youth Work Priorities



Youth Connexions targets resources where they have most impact (in line with the statutory guidance):

- Target young people in a locality of need e.g. area of high deprivation, high levels of anti-social behaviour or where there is a high risk of young people engaging in risky behaviour.
- Target young people from vulnerable groups.
- Engage young people in decision making processes through youth forums, youth councils, youth issue groups and steering groups.
- Involve young people in their communities through volunteering and social action projects.
- Provide youth work opportunities on Friday and Saturday evenings (particularly linking with first point).

Youth Work



Why is youth work important?

- There is a strong link between young people's personal and social development and life outcomes, including educational attainment, health, employment status and behaviour.
- It recognises that youth work is key to the development of these skills and capabilities "through the provision of developmental educational opportunities: space for young people to actively learn, to participate, and to take responsibility".






