


Please find attached the crime and anti-social behaviour figures for the first six months of this fiscal year.

At the end of the last complete year 2011-12, the drop in All Crime across the Borough was 11% compared to the previous year, so to have achieved a further reduction on already reducing figures over the six month period of 14% is a very good indication of the strong Community Safety performance here in Dacorum.

The chart below illustrates the numbers of crimes this six month period for the whole of Dacorum along with Hemel Hempstead, Berkhamsted and Tring compared to the same period in the previous year.



The following table illustrates the percentage reduction across the borough for All Crime.




Behind these figures there are individual wards and categories which do not display such a positive performance. For example, in the burglary category, there are individual wards which are showing increases some of these being Leverstock Green, Bennetts End, Woodhall Farm, Nash Mills, Berkhamsted Castle, Northchurch and Tring East.

As the figures are monitored regularly by the Partnership (daily by the Police) these trends are picked up quickly and a partnership response is formulated. Dacorum CSP is now participating in Operation "Guardian", which aims to tackle and reduce burglary by combining the joint resources of partnership agencies.

An example of this that DBC street wardens have been tasked to focus their activities in wards which are showing increases in offences. In a similar vein, Fire & Rescue Services resources have been briefed on where the areas of concern are and whilst out and about on their Fire & Rescue related tasks ensure that their routes to and from their operating centres take them through identified wards, the rationale being that as well as being more eyes and ears out and about, they are, merely by their presence, likely to deter offenders from committing burglaries.

Reported incidents of antisocial behaviour continue to fall (25% in the first six months of this year against a reduction of 20% for the whole of the previous year) See chart below.
