This performance report has been prepared for the Dacorum District Community Safety Partnership (CSP) to highlight the level of activity within the District and the Fire and Rescue Service's performance against the former National Indicators.

The data contained within this report covers the period from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2012 to the end of July 2012, Ward and District comparisons show the latest available data up to the end of July 2012

CSP colleagues will be aware that the National Indicator set has been reduced and the indicators previously related to the Fire and Rescue Service have been withdrawn. However, the Fire and Rescue Service has chosen to continue to monitor the following indicators to compare relative performance.

- NI.33 – Deliberate Fires
- NI.49 Primary fires, primary fire deaths and injuries.

The targets set for each indicator for 2012/13 are aimed to position HFRS into the national upper quartiles of performance compared with all other Fire and Rescue Authorities (FRAs)

For each indicator, there are charts showing:

- The monthly activity and a 3 year comparison for both the County as a whole and for the District to demonstrate the trend in performance.
- The current activity compared with the other District Council CSP areas.
- The level of activity at Ward.

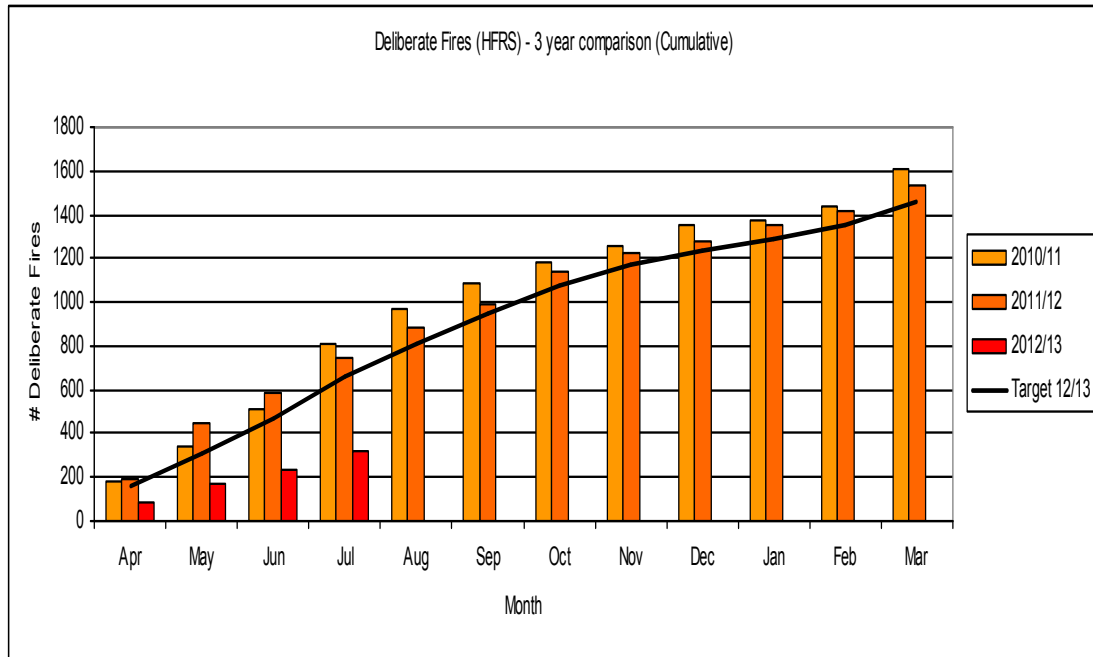

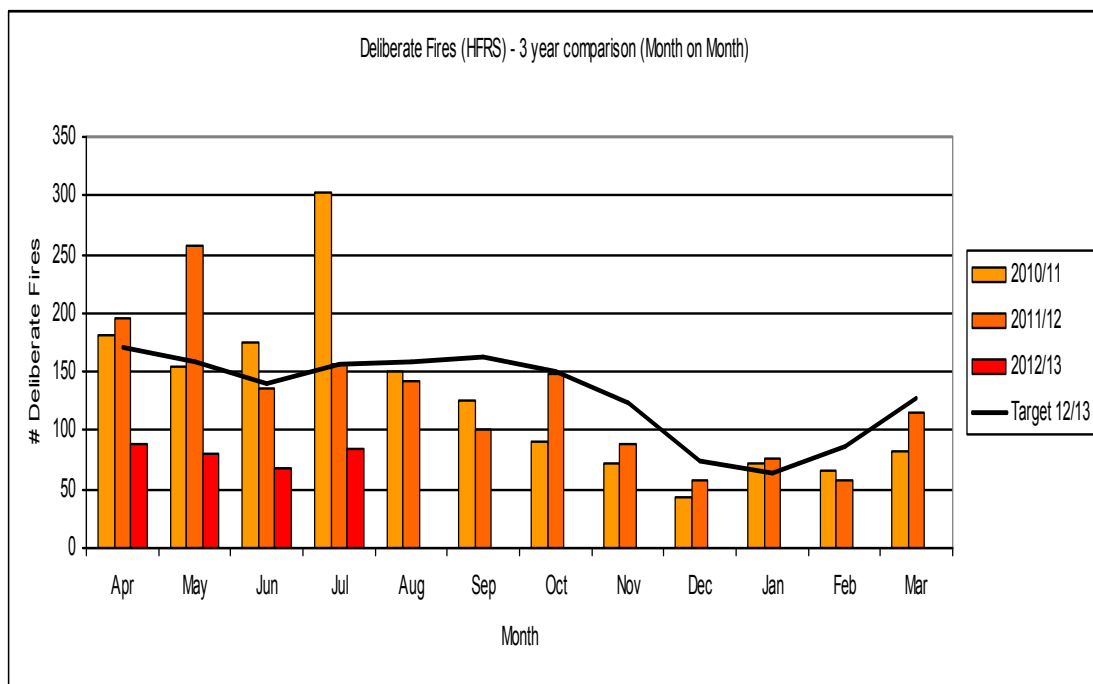
### NI.33 Deliberate Fires

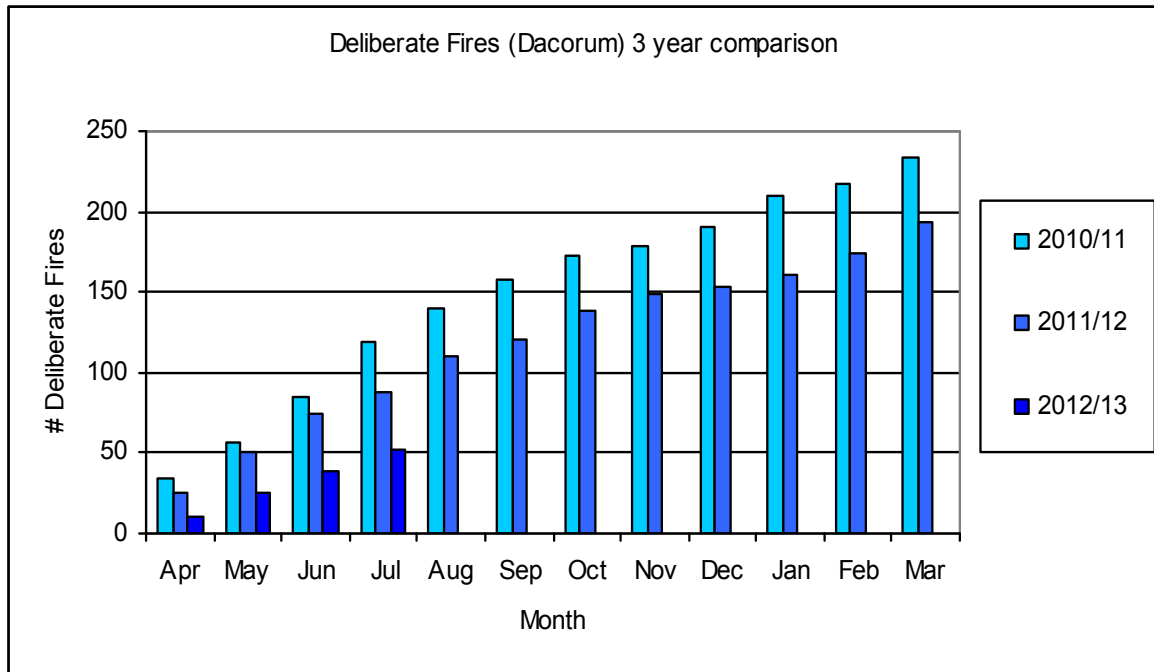
**Fig.1a Deliberate Fires in Hertfordshire (Cumulative)**

Deliberate Fires (LAA1 priority) in buildings, vehicles and other outdoor locations have fallen by 57% this year across the County compared with the same period last year (Fig.1a).

**Fig. 1b Deliberate Fires in Hertfordshire (Month on Month)**

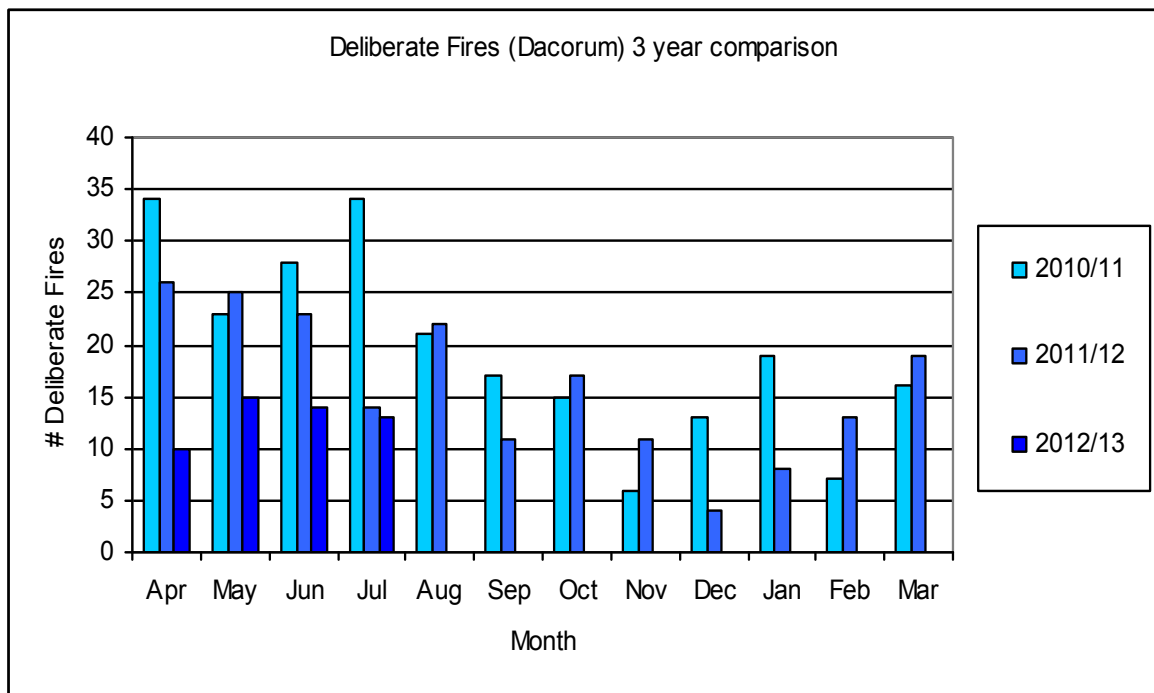


**Fig.2 Deliberate Fires in Dacorum (Cumulative)**



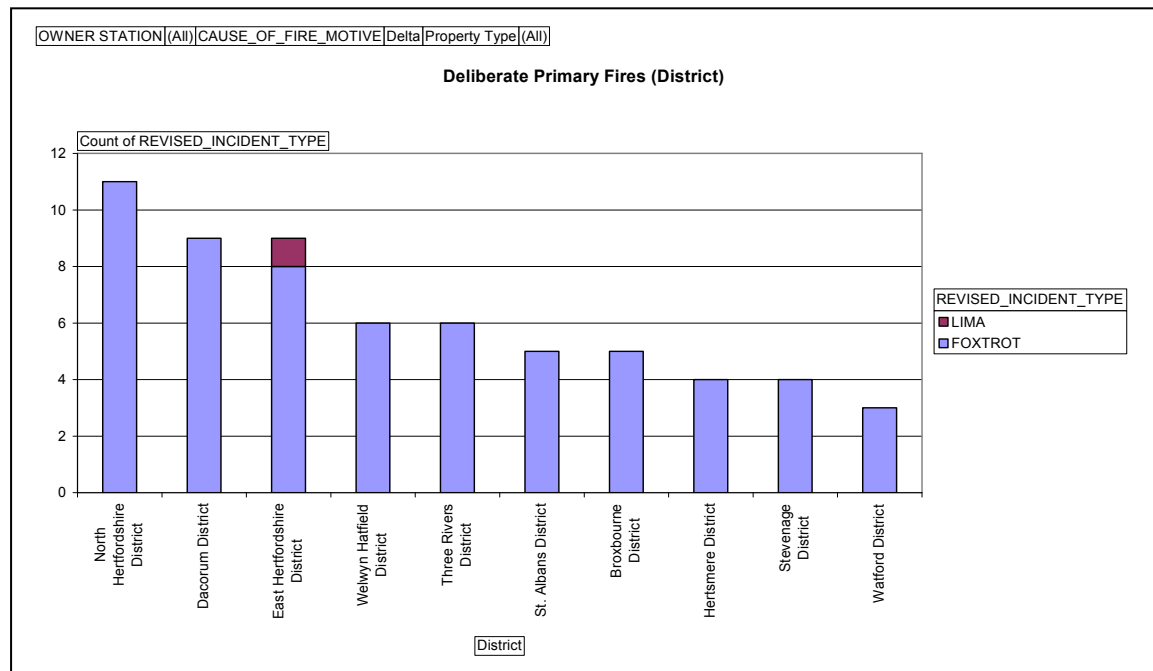
Deliberate Fires in Dacorum this year have fallen by 41%, compared with the same period last year. (Fig.2)

**Fig.2a Deliberate Fires in Dacorum (Month on Month)**



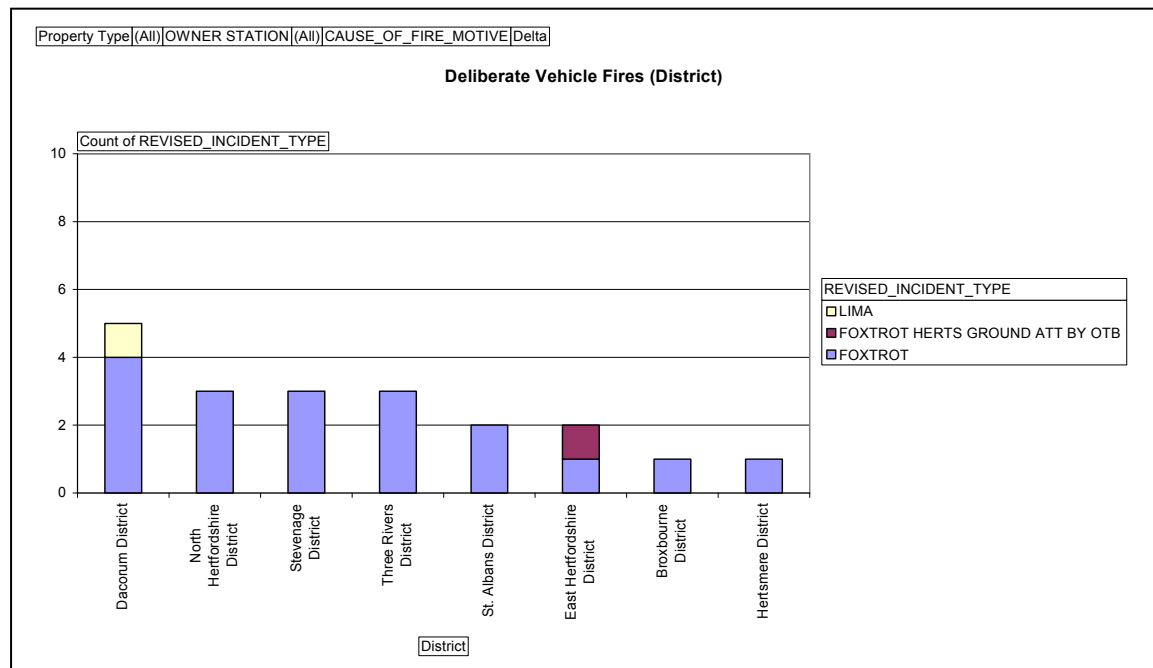

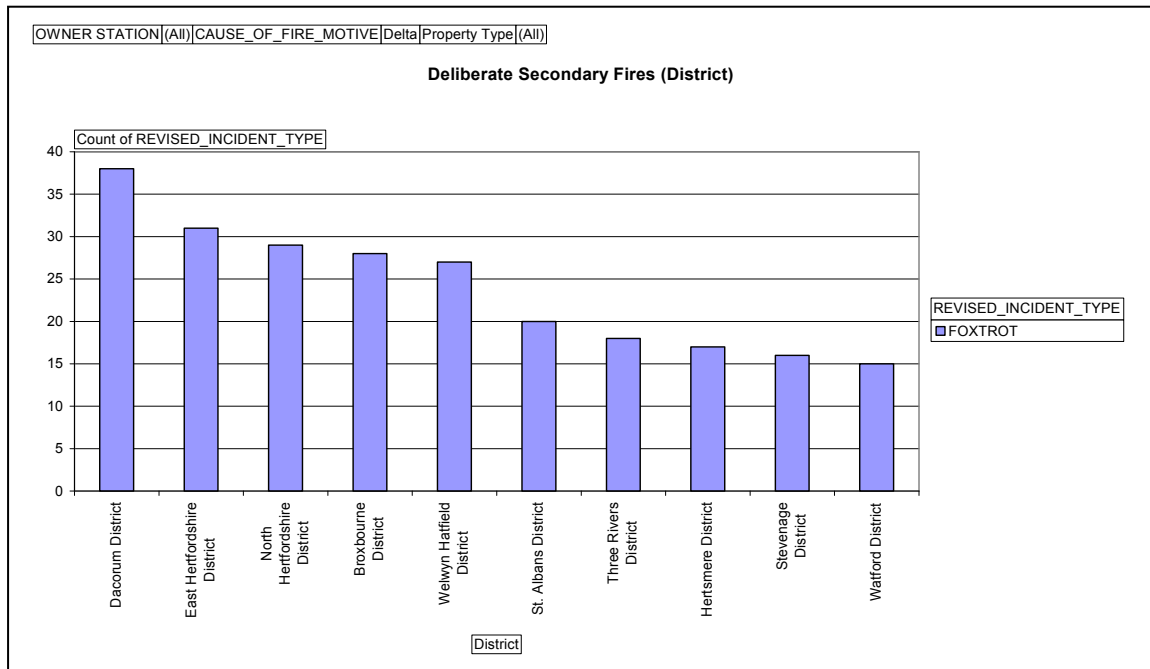
North Herts had the highest number of Deliberate Primary Fires with 11. Watford had the least with 3. (Fig 3)

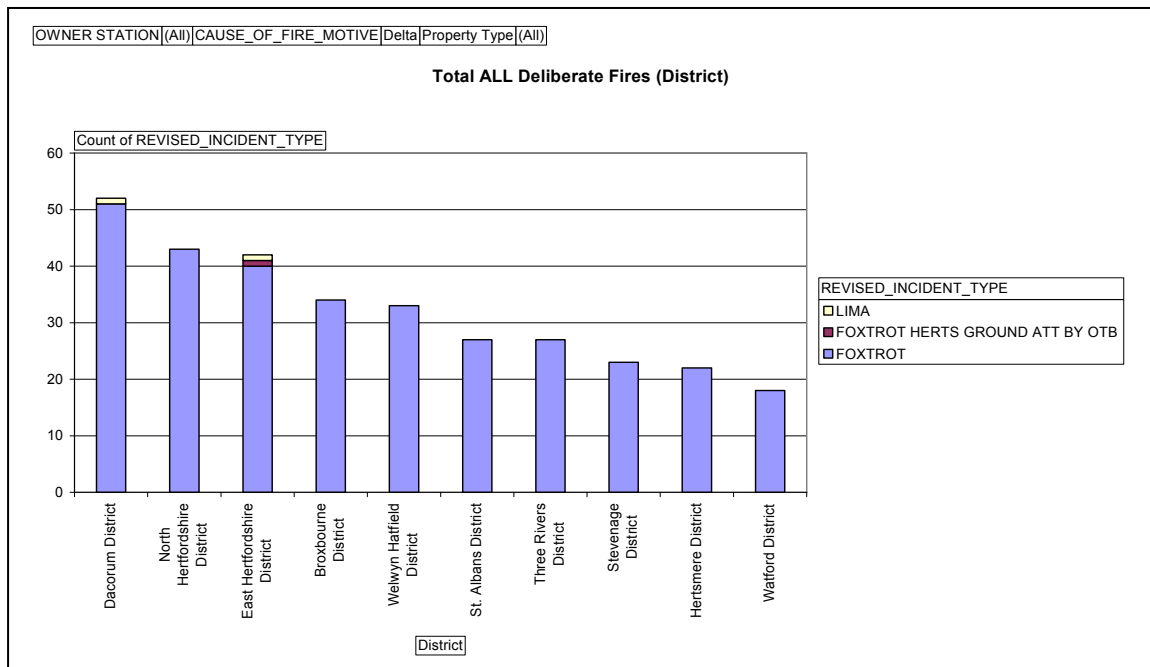
Dacorum, had the highest number of Deliberate Vehicle Fires with 5. Broxbourne, and Hertsmere had the least with 1. (Fig 3a)

Dacorum had the highest number of Deliberate Secondary Fires with 38. Watford had the least with 15. (Fig 3b)

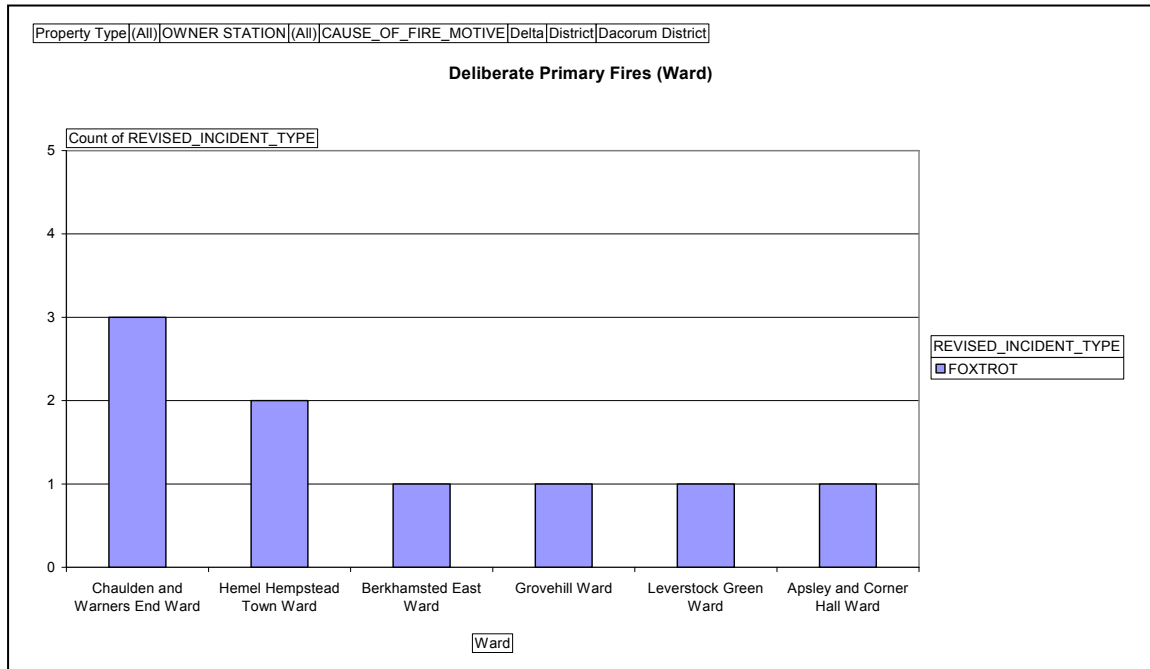

Overall this year Dacorum had the highest number of Deliberate Fires with 52. Watford had the least with 18. (Fig. 3c)

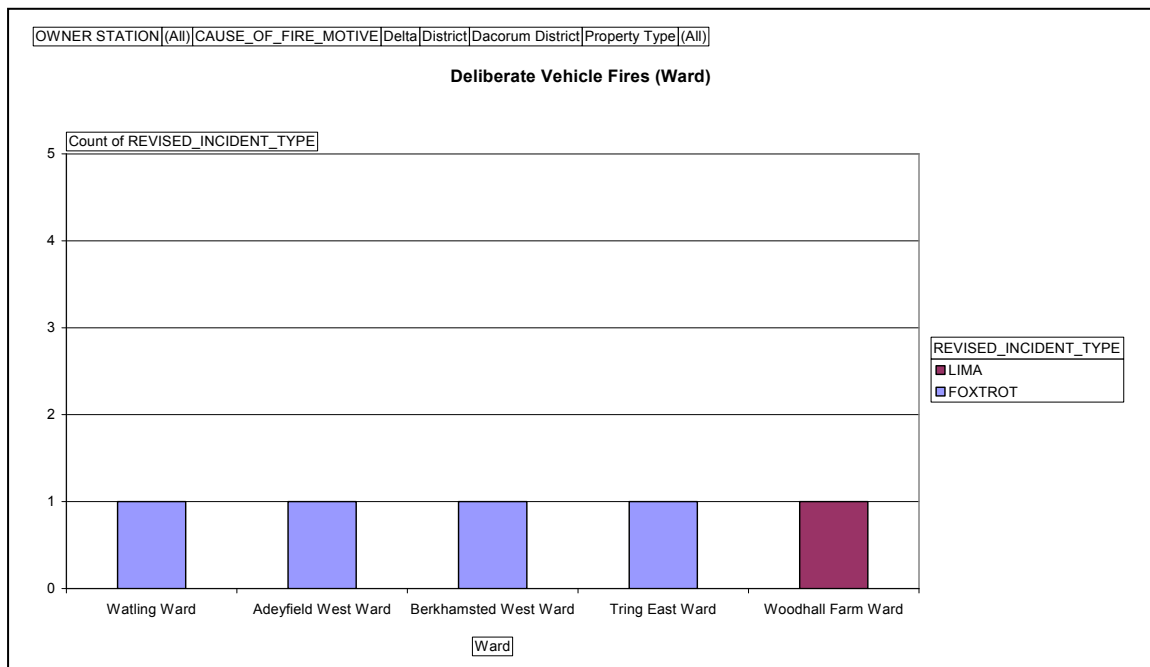
**Deliberate Fires by Ward, Dacorum District (April 2012- July 2012)**

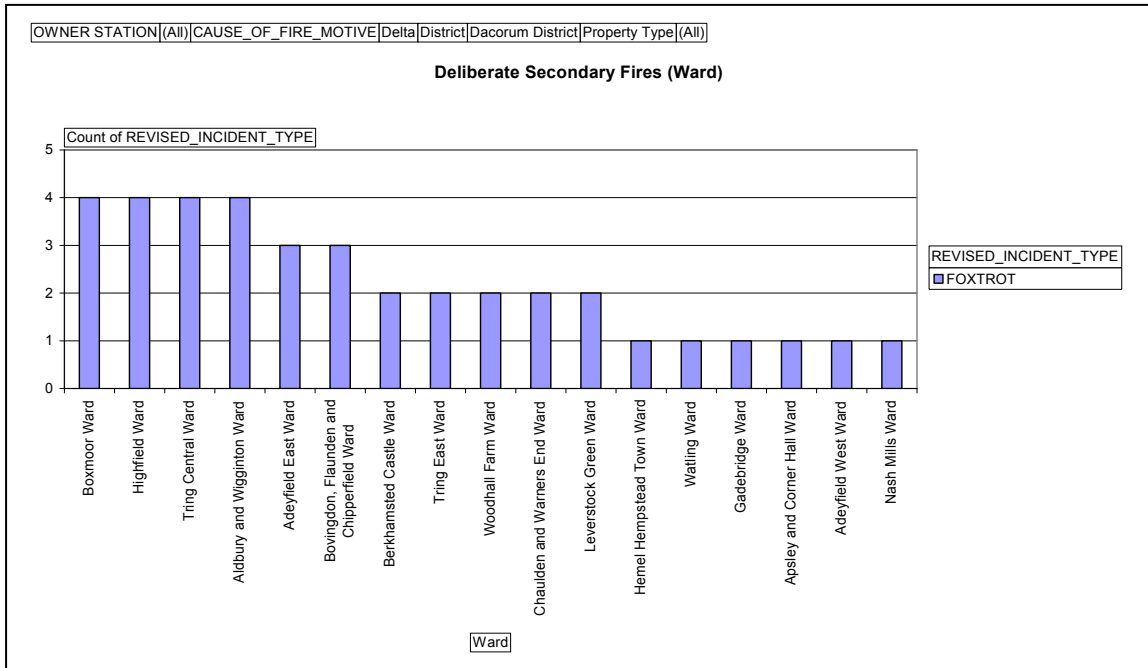
Chaulden and Warners End Ward had the highest number of Deliberate Primary Fires with 3. A number of Wards had 0. (Fig 4)

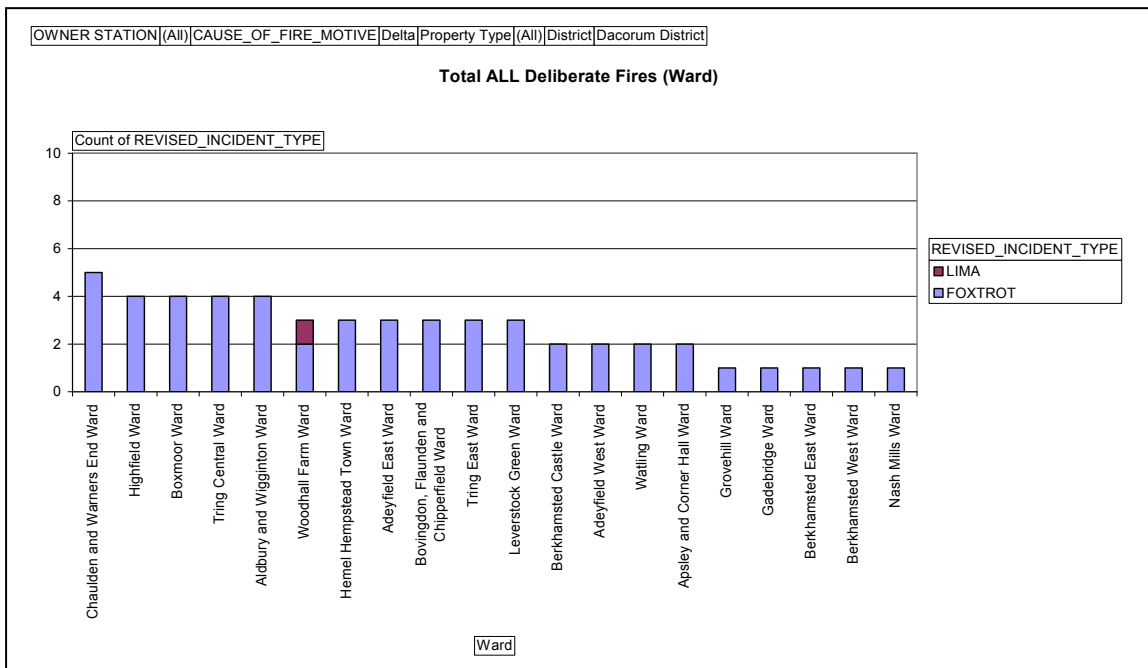

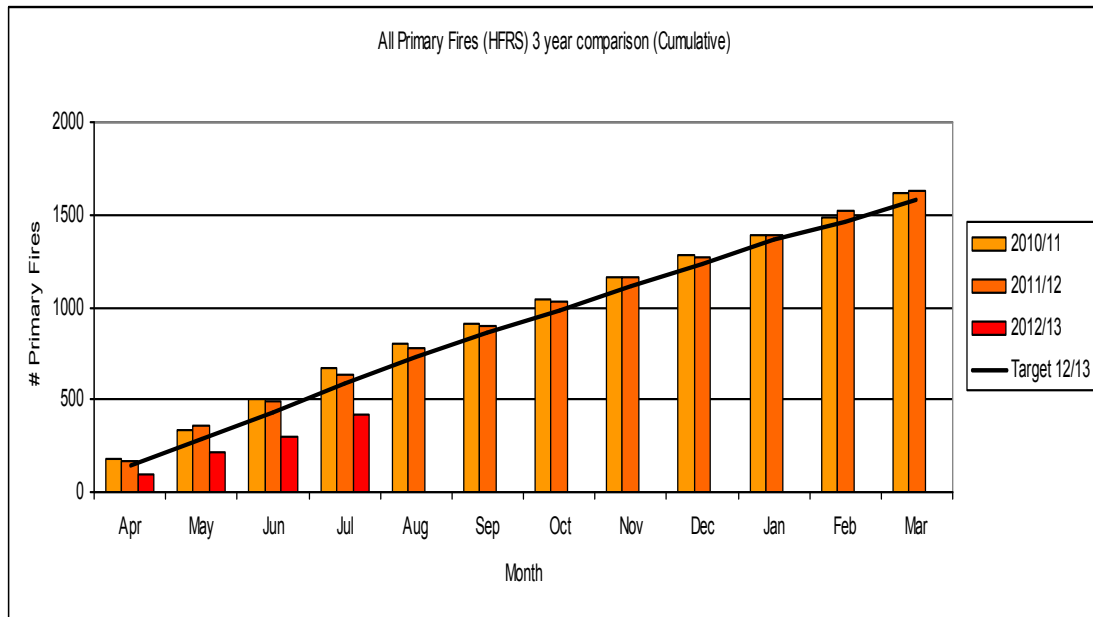


Overall this year Chaulden and Warners End Ward had the highest number of Deliberate Fires with 5. A number of Wards had 0 (Figs.4c)

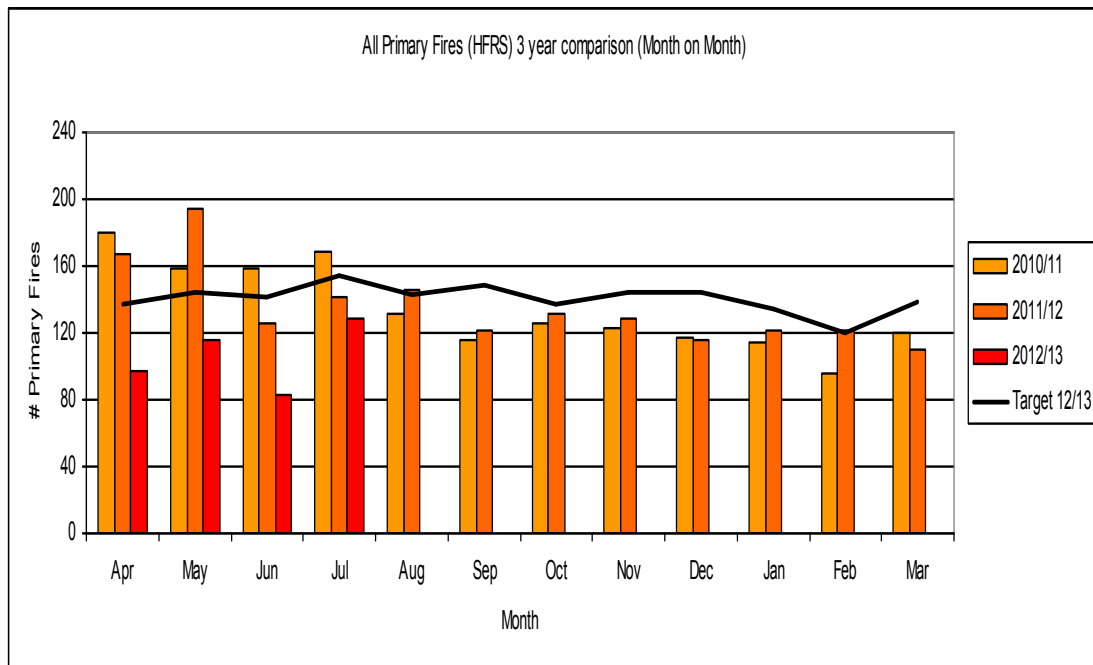
**NI.49 Primary Fires**

**Fig.5a Primary Fires in Hertfordshire (Cumulative)**

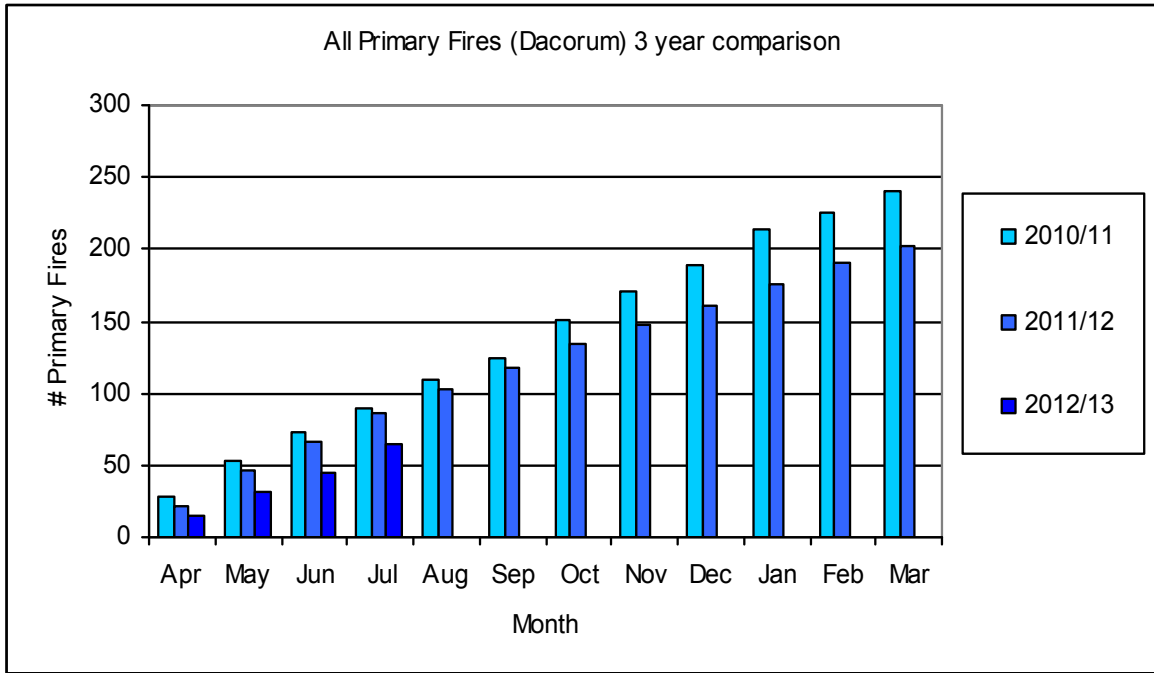


**Fig.5b Primary Fires in Hertfordshire (Month on Month)**



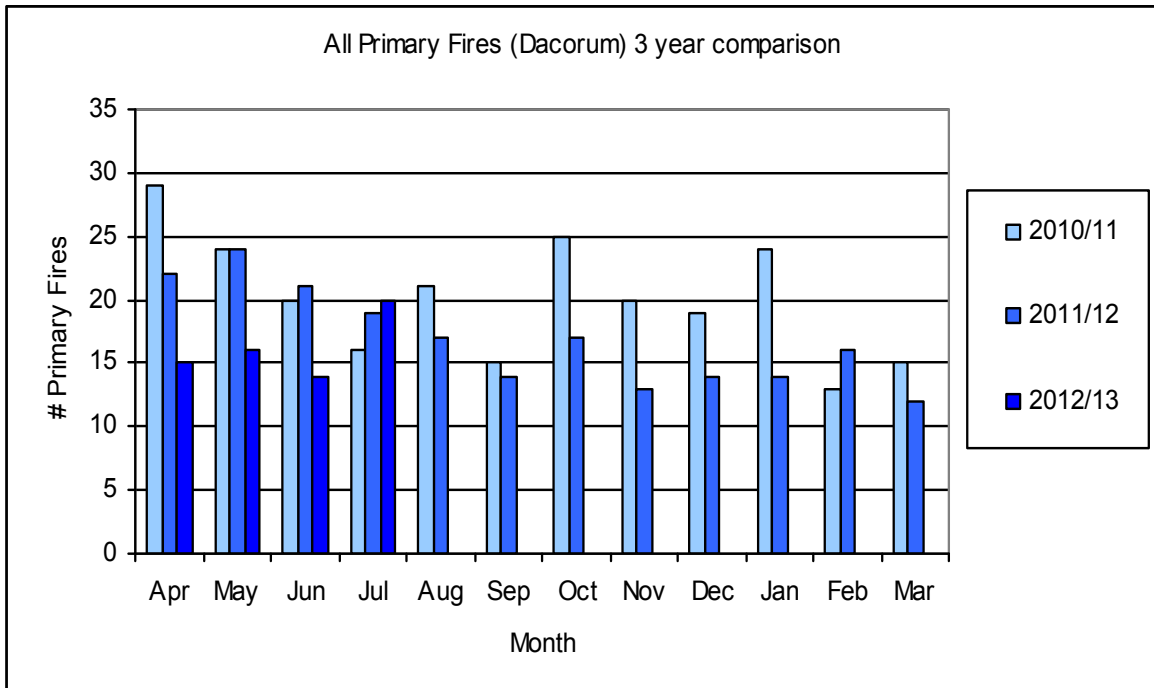
**Fig.6a Primary Fires in Dacorum (Cumulative)**





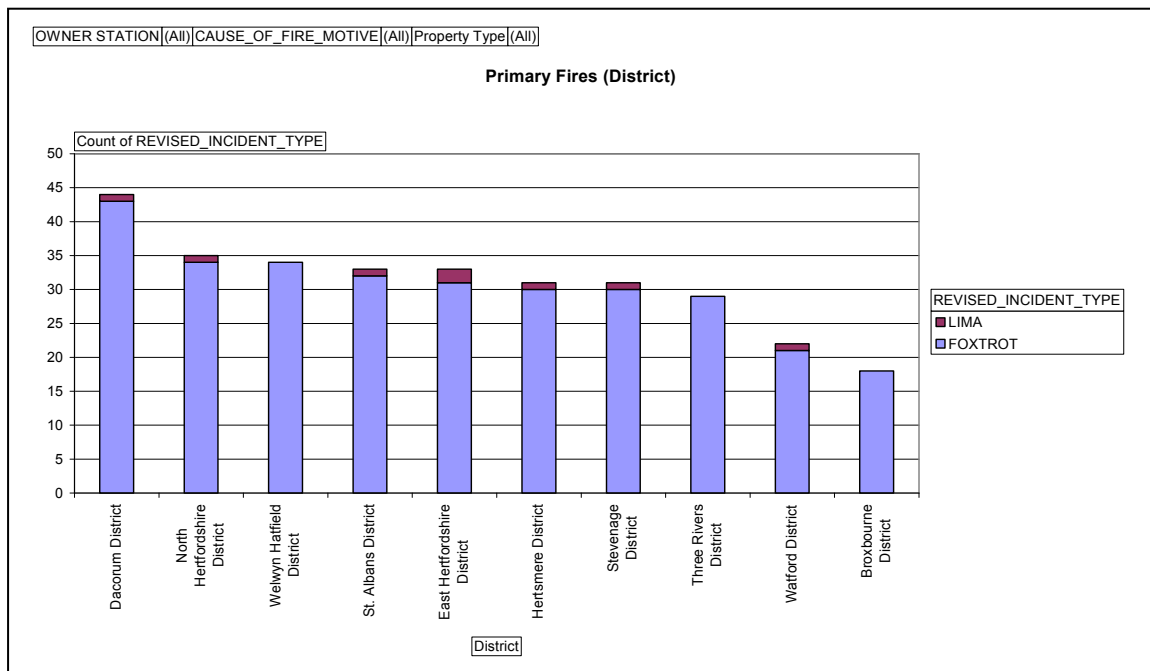
Primary Fires across Dacorum this year have fallen by 24% compared with the same period last year (Fig 6a).

**Fig.6b Primary Fires in Dacorum (Month on Month)**



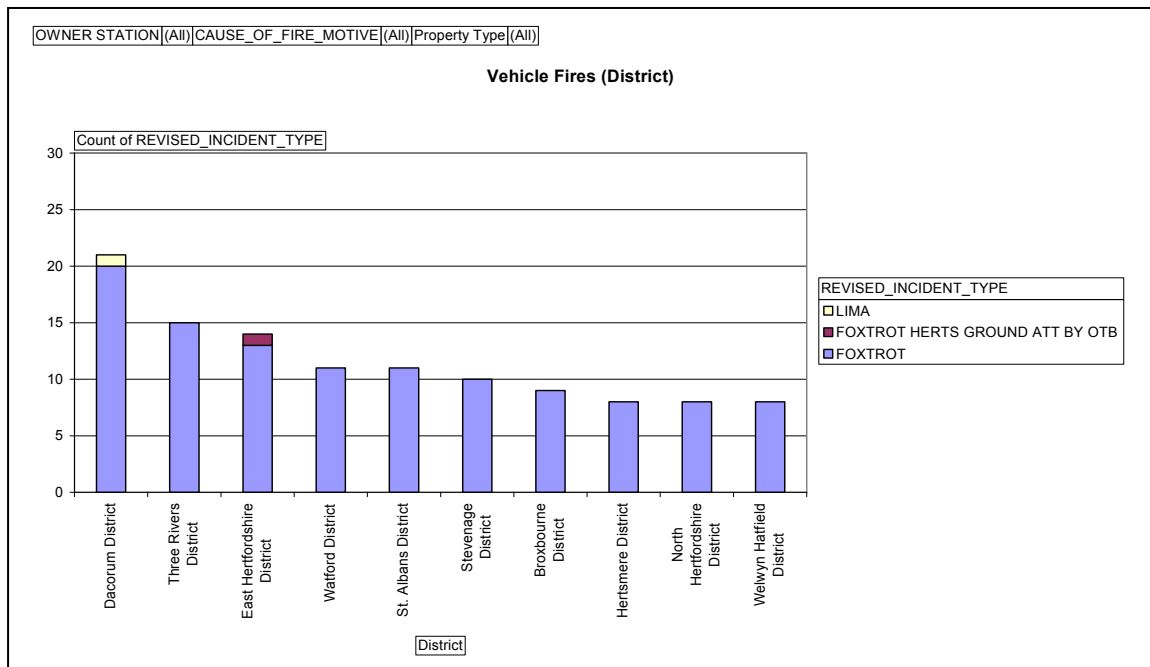

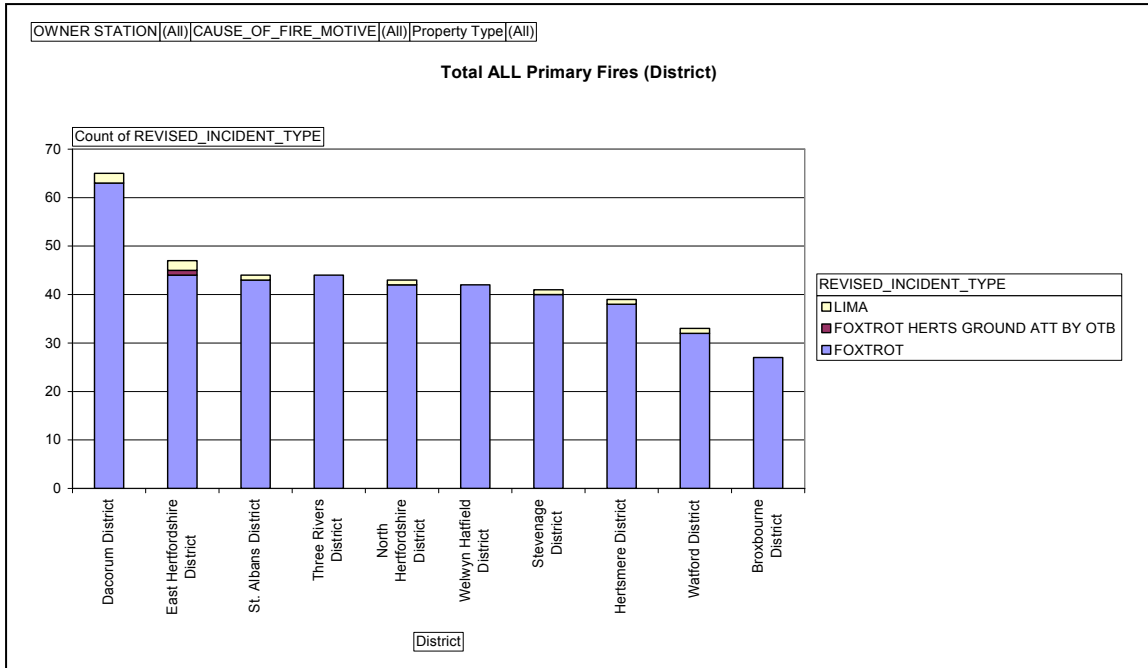
Dacorum had the highest number of Primary Fires this year with 44. Broxbourne had the least with 18. (Fig 7)

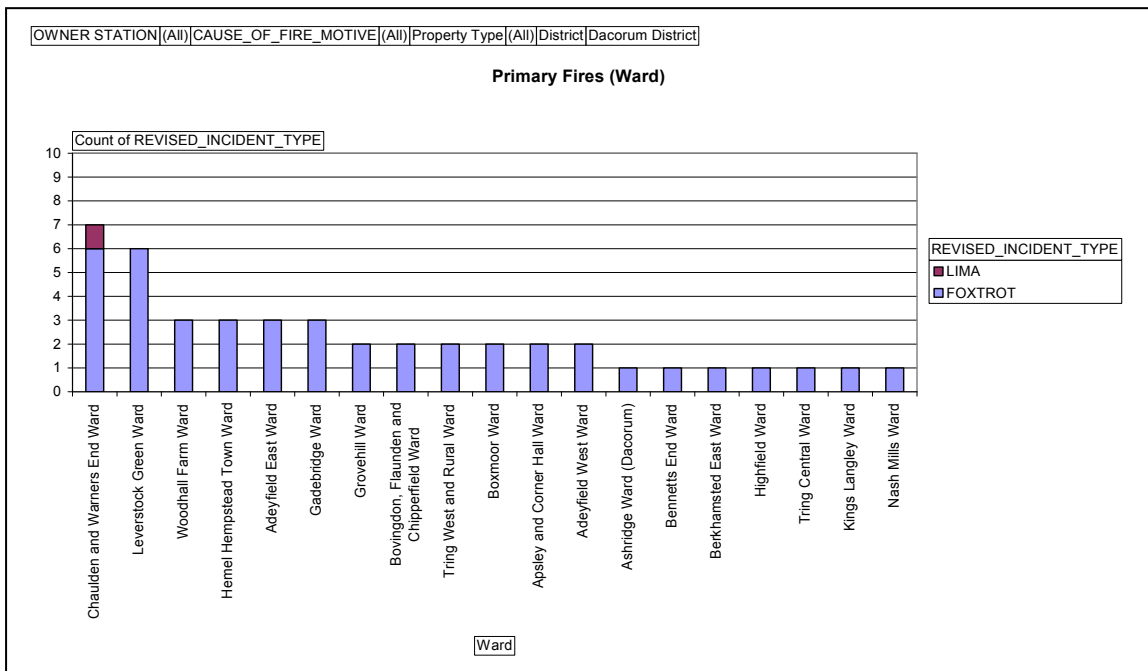

Overall Dacorum had the highest number of Primary Fires with 65. Broxbourne had the least with 27. (Fig 7b)

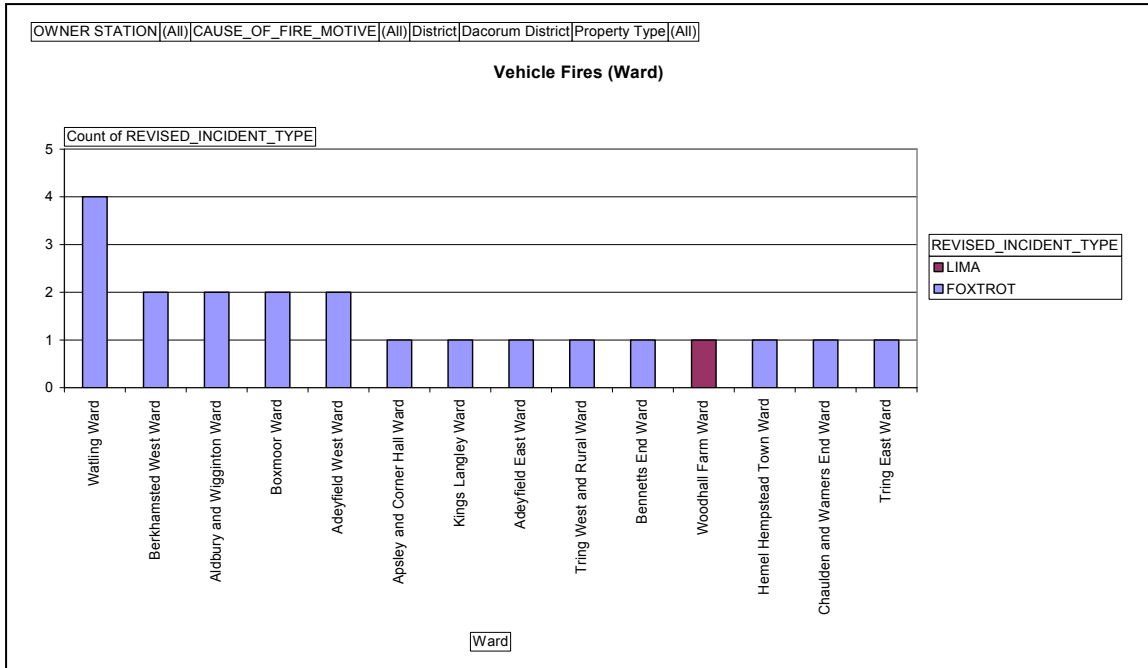

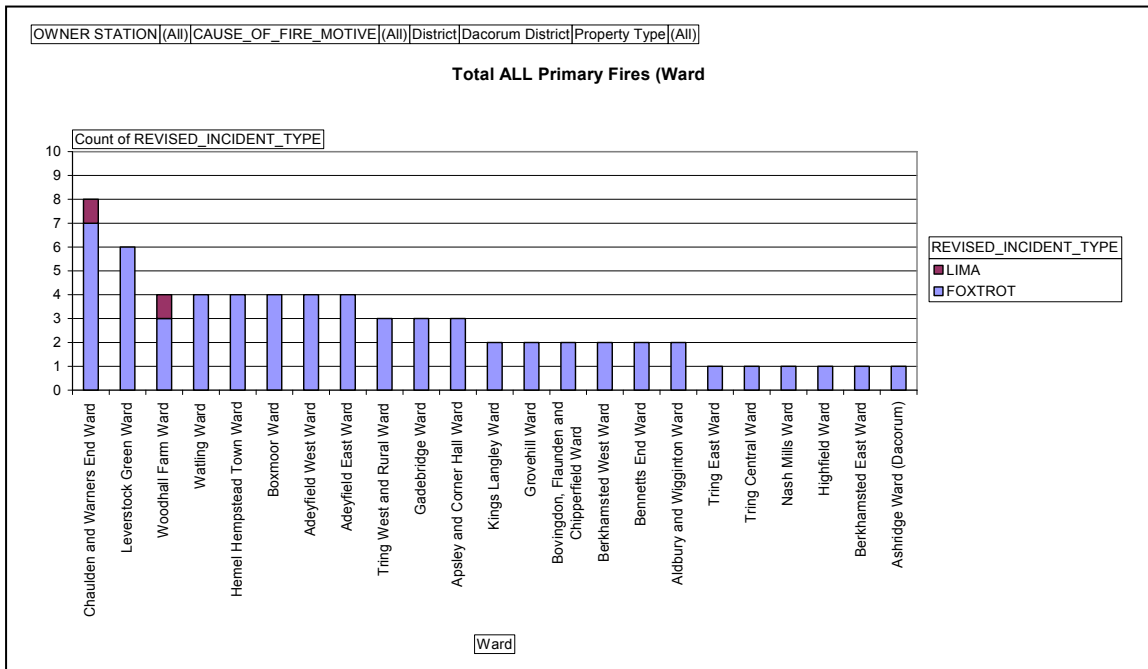
Chaulden and Warners End Ward had the highest number of Primary Fires this year with 7. A number of Wards had 0. (Fig 8)

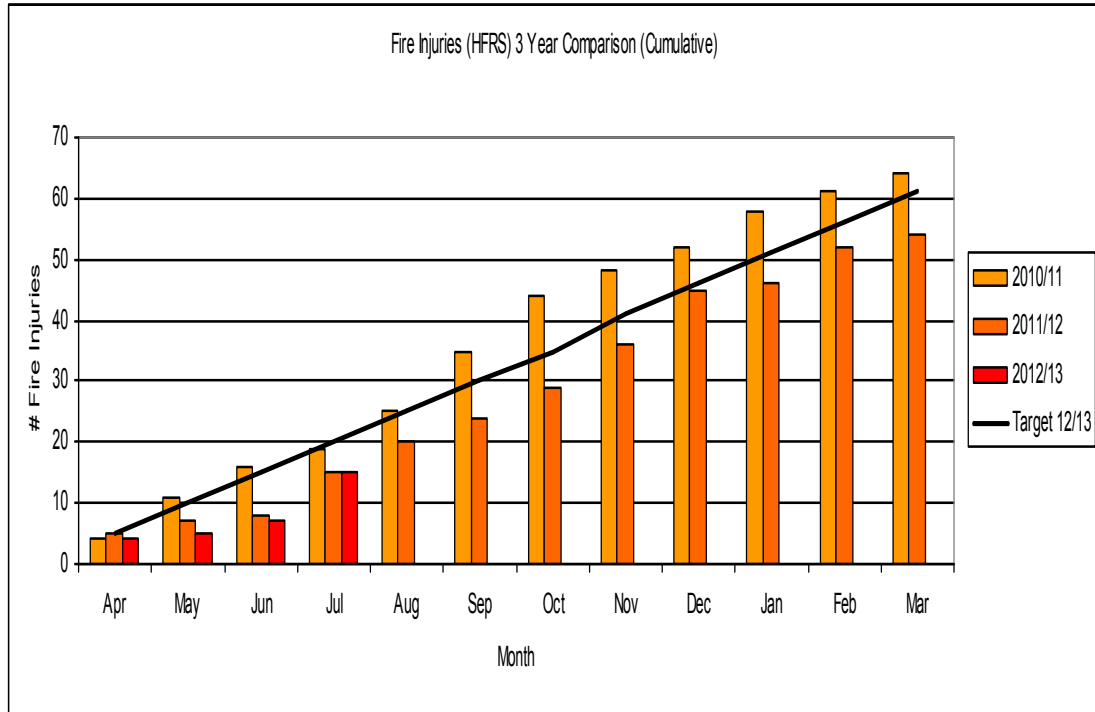

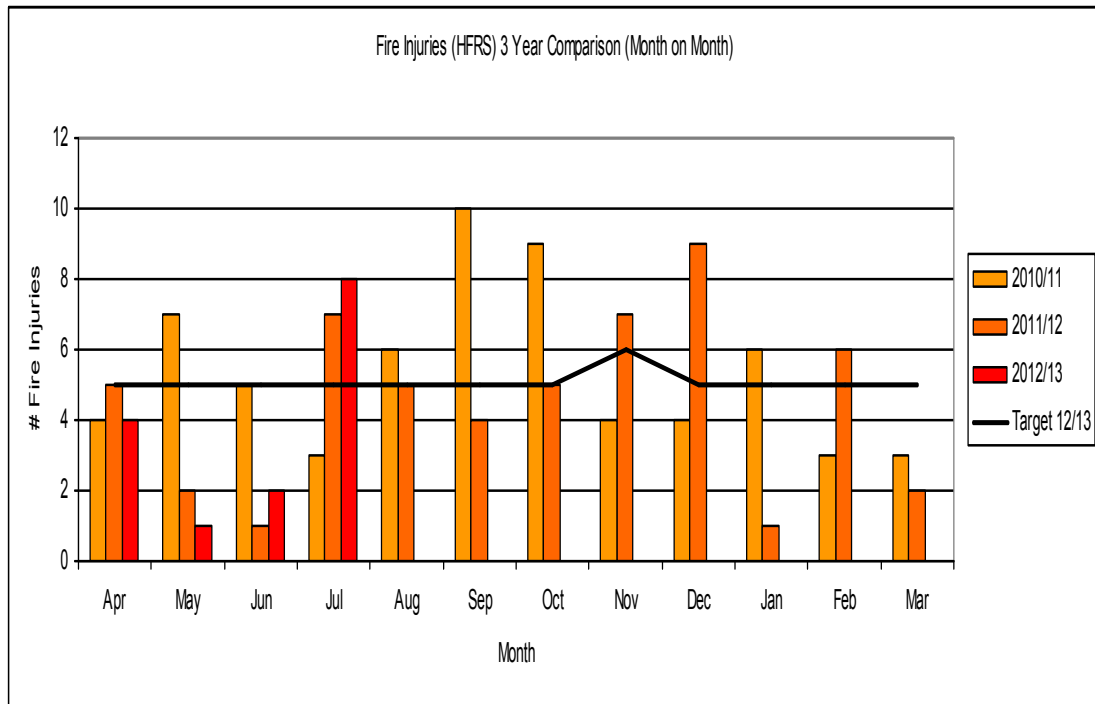
**Primary Fire Injuries**

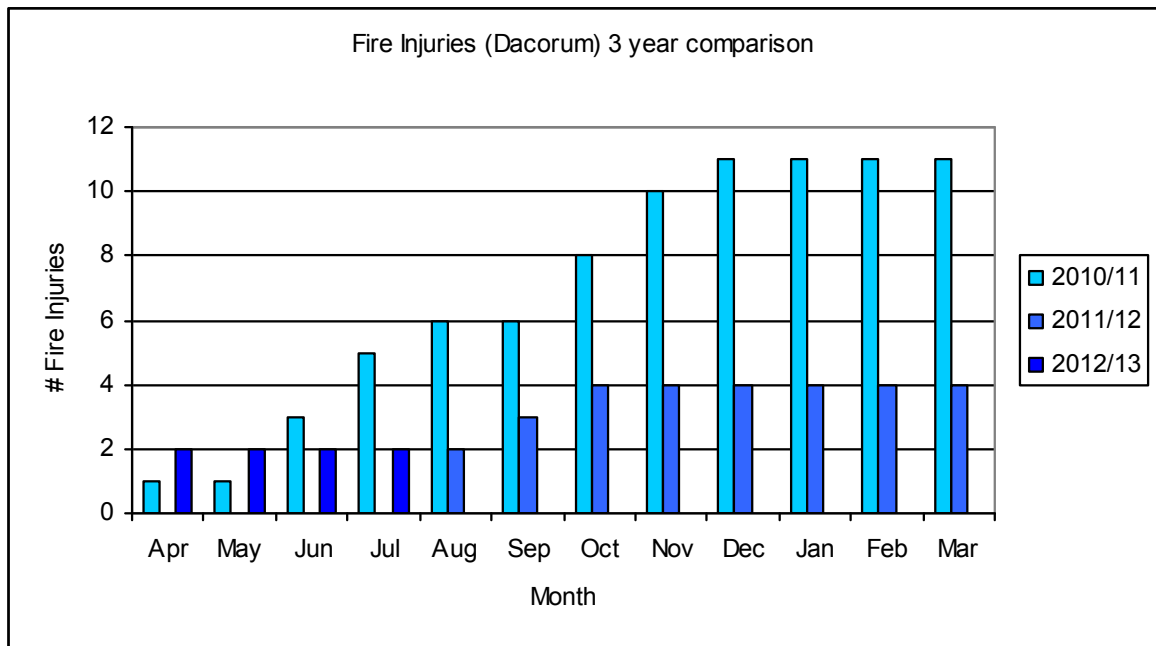
**Fig.9a All Primary Fire Injuries in Hertfordshire (Cumulative)**

Primary Fire Injuries across the County are equal with 15, compared with the same period last year (Fig 9a)

**Fig.9b All Primary Fire Injuries in Hertfordshire (Month on Month)**

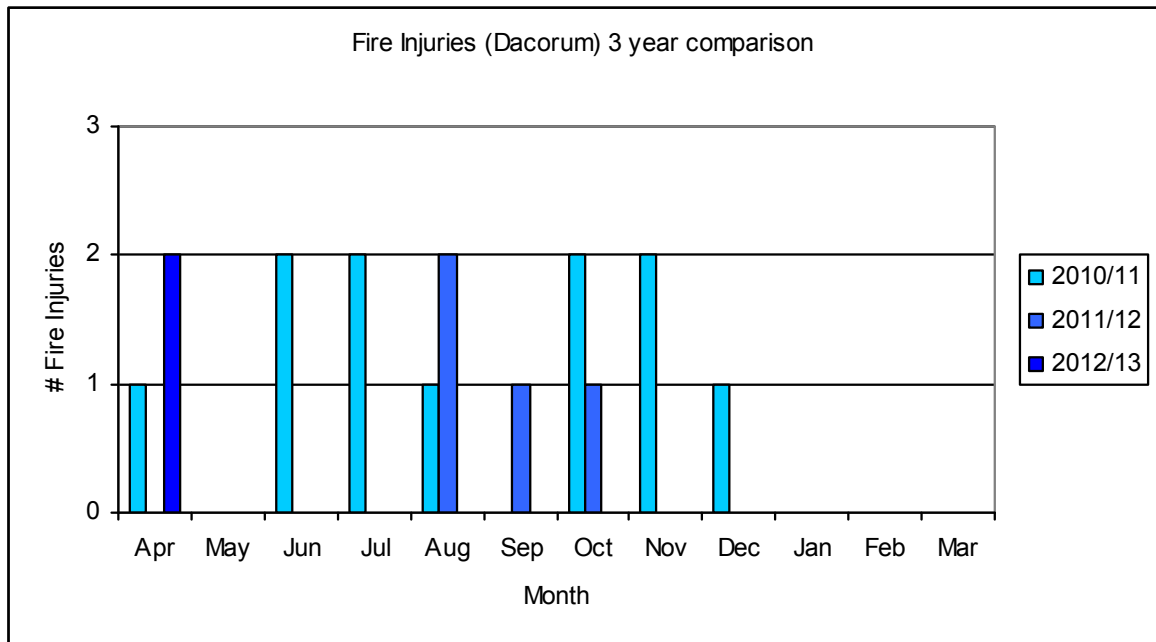


**Fig.10a Primary Fire Injuries in Dacorum (Cumulative)**
