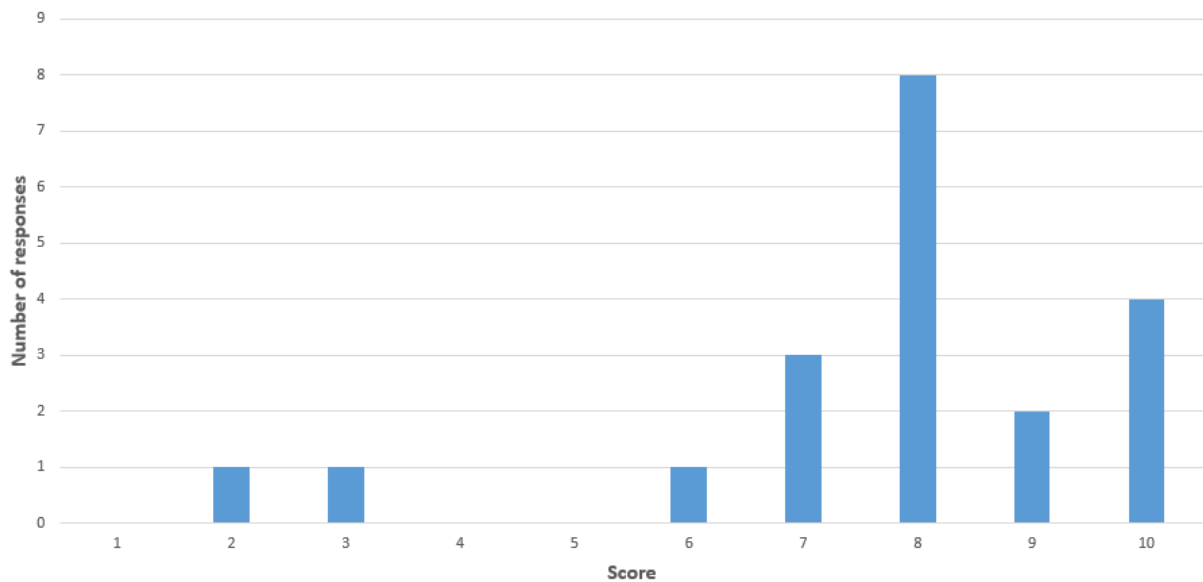

### Objectives:

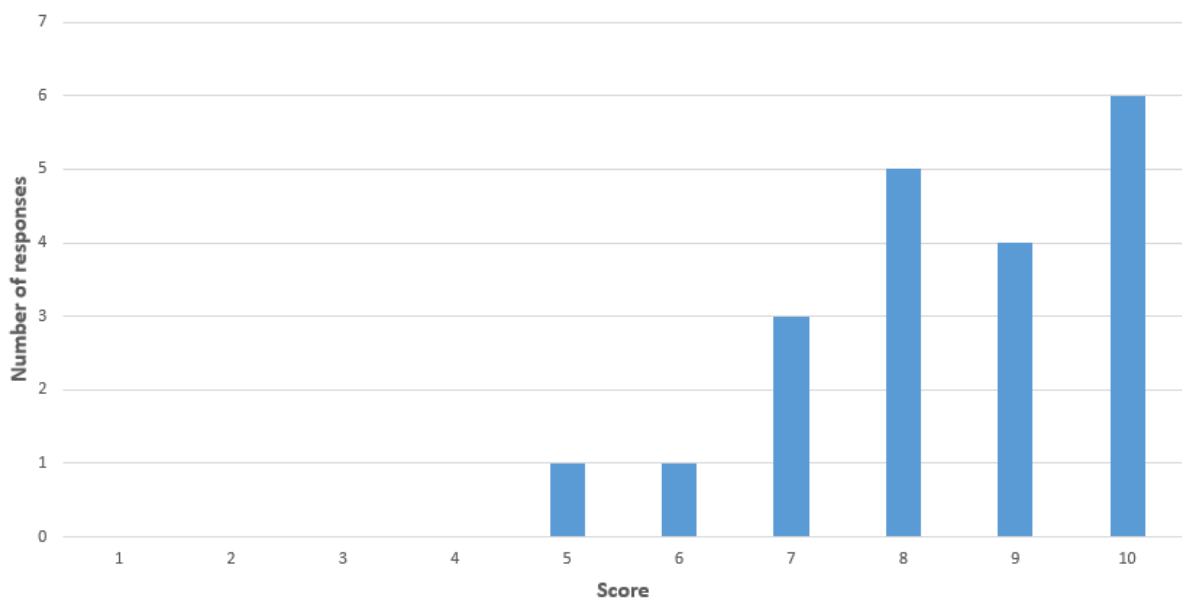
A session on Overview and Scrutiny:

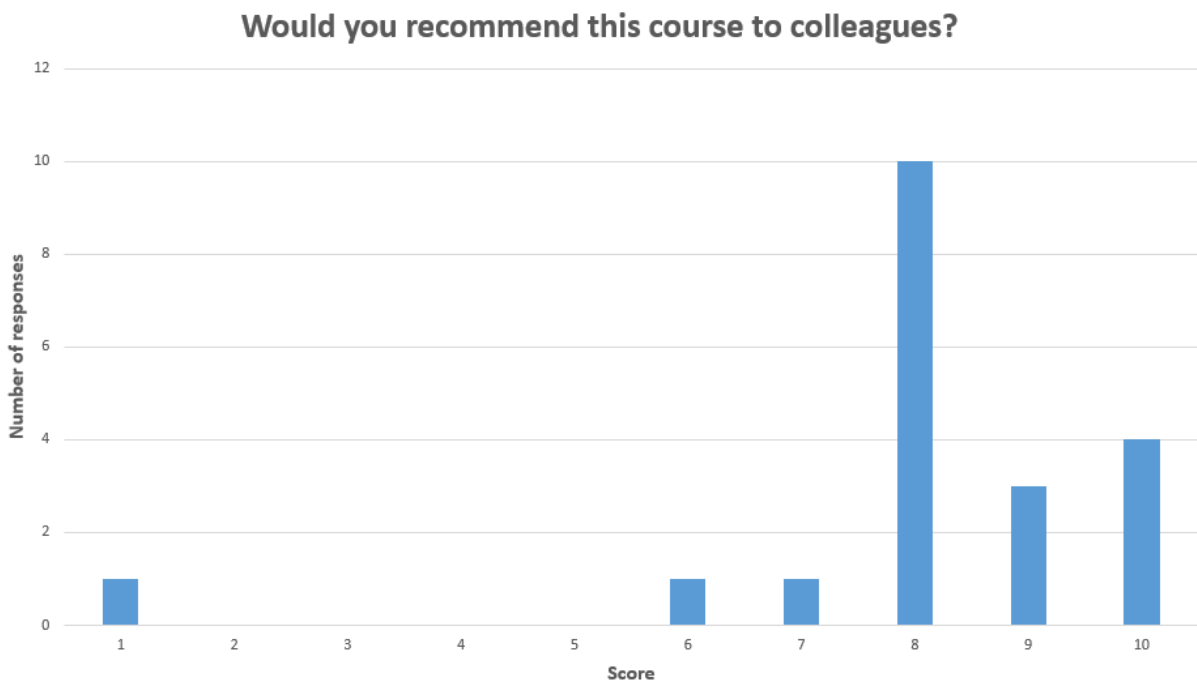
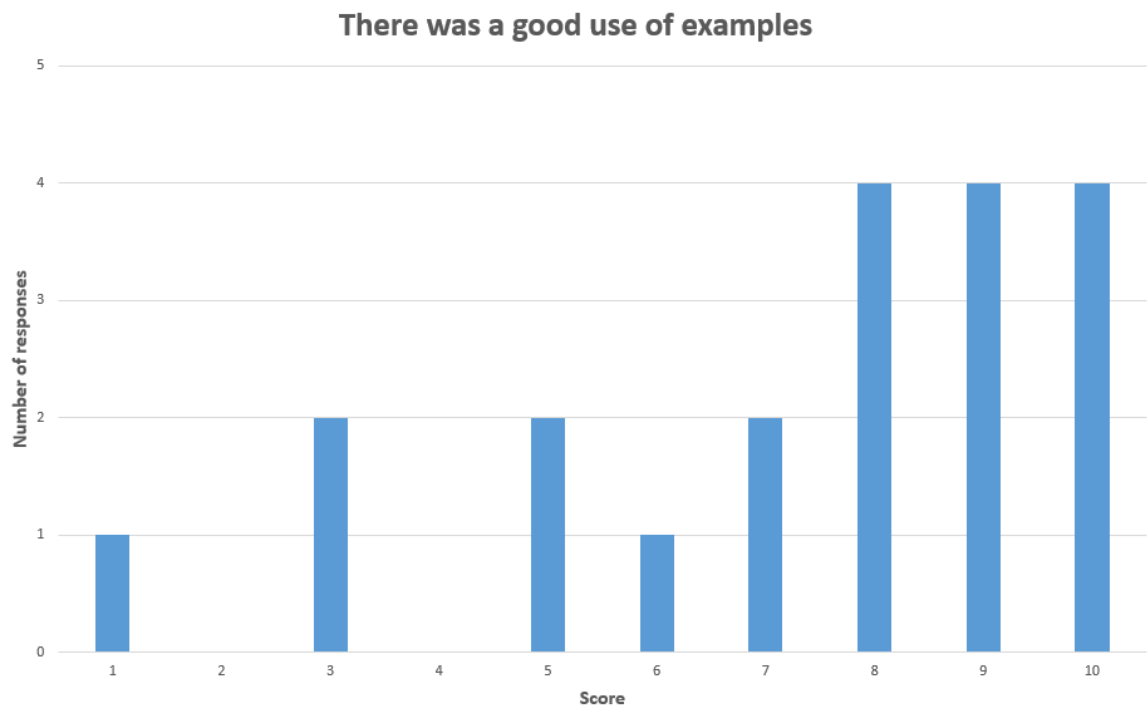


### The pace of the meeting was reasonable
