Decision: The approval to award contract for Procurement of 2 Wheel Bins for a four-year contract period to ESE World Ltd under the ESPO Framework 860_22 Lot 1A

Reason:

To secure the future procurement of the supply of 2 wheeled bins to meet current procurement regulations.

Commissioning process:

The requirement is arguably 'more of the same' for the repair of existing proprietary equipment. Given the spares held by Environmental Services to service and repair the current cohort of bins, which mitigates the volume of new replacements purchased, any change would increase the amount of stock and costs.
