The primary objectives are:

- **Growth and Evolution**: The plan envisions Maylands evolving into a seamlessly integrated part of the Hemel Garden Communities, both physically and functionally.
- Quality: The goal is to enhance Maylands' appeal as a business location by focusing on quality, not just size and strategic location.
- **Economic Diversification**: The plan seeks to broaden Maylands' economic base by attracting a wider range of high-value economic activities and leveraging sustainable technologies.
- **Sustainable Movement**: The plan aims to implement more sustainable and efficient approaches for transporting people and goods.
- Effective Land Use: The plan emphasises making efficient use of available land and repurposing buildings that are reaching the end of their economic life.

The proposal is driven by the need to respond to future commercial, economic, environmental, and societal changes. The plan also aims to capitalise on the opportunities presented by the Hemel Garden Communities initiative and Herts IQ to create a thriving and sustainable business environment.

Stakeholders who will be affected by the Maylands Masterplan Plus include:

- **The Public:** Local residents and the wider community will be impacted by the changes in the area, including new developments and infrastructure improvements
- **Service Users:** Businesses and employees within Maylands will be directly affected by the changes in the business park, including new facilities, transportation options, and the overall quality of the environment.
