¹ It should be noted that Section 106 agreements with financial obligations are almost always linked to planning applications – but not all sites granted planning permission are developed immediately or indeed at all, and there may be multiple planning applications for the same site. Therefore this represents a maximum figure which is greater than will be received in reality.

The Infrastructure List

A report to Cabinet in November 2016 detailed the following themes that the Infrastructure Advisory Group identified as priorities for funding:

Dacorum Borough Council's Regulation 19 Local Plan was approved by full Council in October 2024 and the public consultation took place between 04 November 2024 and 17 December 2024. It is expected that the Local Plan be submitted to the planning inspectorate in early 2025.

A draft Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP) https://letstalk.dacorum.gov.uk/local-plan-to-2041-and-evidence has been developed and is being consulted on alongside the Regulation 19 Local Plan. A draft IDP will be included in the examination in public. As the examination process moves forward further clarity on infrastructure priorities will emerge and a CIL Spending Strategy will be finalised.
